## Presidents Report 10<sup>th</sup> December, 2013

All I can think about this year is RAIN! Four fantastic events were planned and only three made it out of the starting block. Our May event was cancelled due to rain and by some amazing feat we found another date available and managed to reschedule for 30<sup>th</sup> June. All the pieces came together perfectly and we were ready to roll – till it rained again! At that point we surrendered to the weather and cancelled the May/June event for the year! February was an exciting comp with not only our highest number of entries I've seen but it was the first time we have offered Freestyle. Early in the year "A" Level judge, Anna O'Keppel approached us about running freestyle and the idea of this was to allow our riders to practice freestyles at the friendly "home" environment, preparing them for States and Nationals or just for a bit of fun. This was put into place with participation ribbons only and no placings, just an acknowledgement of the % level each rider scored. Anna also kindly sponsored participation ribbons and percentage badges to get this off the ground and now freestyle has become a regular feature. What a fun event this turned out to be! I really enjoyed bopping along to the tunes while watching the competitors put together some lovely freestyles, I look forward to more riders having a go.

This year NSW State Dressage Championships were put together by Sue Baker with the assistance of WDA. Our main roles in this event were arranging the volunteers, riders bags and sponsors as well as being onsite throughout the event to assist as needed. Arranging sponsors and the subsequent trade stalls is a HUGE job and thankfully Leanne Shead (WDA Sponsor Coordinator), stepped up and took on this role. I offer a heartfelt thanks to Leanne for taking this role on and being at the event each day, you sure showed what WDA committee are made of (and may have just prevented me running people over in a buggy)!

Clinics were definitely a feature this year. I'll leave the update on clinics for the clinic report but it was good to see regular and varied clinics back on the agenda. I look forward to watching and hopefully participating in more next year. I would still love to have a protocol day/clinic find its way onto the calendar next year and I challenge anyone – committee or member to take this on and make it happen, I feel it would be a great opportunity at a local level to really practice our test riding and have a judge work us through a test.

In DNSW/EA updates there were changes to the EA membership structure this year. I am interested to see how this pans out and how it is received throughout the EA/dressage community. WDA have survey going out this week to gather a better understanding of what our members want to see happen at the club and how the EA changes influence their competition decisions. This feedback will be then used to ensure we continuously make changes to meet our members needs and improve our offerings.

Next year sees new tests coming out and my personal highlight is no sitting trot at Novice – YIPPEE!! Jan Geary is running a seminar on these tests on the 17th January and I encourage all riders to attend.

I would like to remind our members that WDA is willing and able to assist in any way for members in their quest to become judges or upgrade. We will support any shadowing requests where feasible and if the need arises run a judges seminar at one of our events.

Finally, thanks to all the committee for another busy year which was, in my opinion both enjoyable and successful. To any committee members not continuing, if we don't manage to convince you to stay I thank you for all your hard work and look forward to seeing you in the arena next year! 

### FACT SHEET - Running Para Dressage (PD) and Para Equestrian (PE) Classes at Dressage Events

Running Para Equestrian/Para Dressage classes at Dressage Club competition can be easily achieved. It is the future plan for Para Equestrian to become fully integrated with able-bodied dressage and the first step to achieving this is to have them competing side by side at local events.

### Understanding the difference between Para Equestrian and Para Dressage

National Para dressage events are known as Para-Dressage and International Para dressage events are known as Para-Equestrian.

A number of organising committees are running dressage and Para Dressage events side by side. The only difference between running an able bodied dressage class and a Para class is that there are different tests and some classes only require a 20x40m arena.

## You have to be an Equestrian Australia Affiliate to use EA and FEI Para Dressage Rules and Tests. Para Equestrian/Para-Dressage Grades:

Para Equestrian has 5 Grades:

Grade IA - walk only tests

Grade IB - walk and trot

Grade II - walk and trot but canter allowed in the Freestyle

2 Grade III - walk, trot and canter and may show lateral work in Freestyle

 $\ensuremath{\mathbb{D}}$  Grade IV - walk, trot, canter, canter half-pirouettes, three and four

sequence changes and lateral work.

### Size of Arena's for Para Equestrian/Para Dressage:

2 Grades 1 and 2 are held in a 20x40m arena,

2 Grades 3 and 4 are held in a 20x60m arena.

### Judges for Para Equestrian/Para Dressage

International Level (CPEDI 1-3\* Events):

It is necessary to have judges with an FEI Para Equestrian Accreditation 

Rational Level (Grades 1-5):

Novice level judges can judge up to and including Grade 2

Elementary judges up to and including Grade 3

Medium and above can judge all Grades.

### Classification:

② Classification is when the Para-Equestrian rider has had their disability assessed and a classification Grade allocated to their physical ability.

2 All riders must be classified to compete for Para-Dressage and Para-Equestrian Competition

☑ The equipment required to assist with their riding is assessed and approved by the classifier as well. (For example use of 2 whips, double bridle with split reins, use of caller/commander, use of voice etc.) These compensating aids have to be approved by a classifier and must be on their EA or FEI Classification card.

Sitting trot is optional at all grades.

### **Rider Requirements:**

2 Must be registered with EA

12 Have a current classification card which shows their grading as well as any compensating aids

☑ Have a copy of their classification card (should accompany their entry and this copy should also be provided to each of the judges and gear checker so that they are aware of what specialized equipment has been approved for a particular rider.)

#### **Horse Requirements:**

Must be registered with EA

### Allowances for Para Dressage and Para Equestrian Riders at events:

② Grade 1 and 2 riders are allowed to have their trainer/coach warm up the horse for them.

② The trainer must only ride for 20 minutes in a total of 24 hours and must be off the horse 20 minutes prior to the start of the rider's test.

This will be self-managed at local competitions, but is under stewards control at international level competition (3\* and above)

② Presentations: make sure prize winners are not expected to mount the podium for prize giving ceremonies. A flat, wheelchair accessible area is best.

### **Venue Facilities:**

If the venue is set up such that a mounting block is available, this would be ideal, but most riders are used to providing their own so this is not essential.

② A wheelchair access toilet is necessary but public venues are already required to have wheelchair access facilities so most club venues will already meet this requirement.

Disabled parking and preferred parking close to amenities

### Rulebook for Para Dressage and Para Equestrian:

International- Para Equestrian Dressage Rules can be found on

the FEI website and a copy should be available at your event.

National- Para Equestrian Dressage Rules can be found on the

EA website and a copy should be available at your event

### **FEI Para Equestrian Tests:**

There are 3 FEI tests in each grade:

Team test

Individual championship test and

Preestyle test

### **EA Para Equestrian Tests:**

12 There are now also new EA Para dressage tests which are of an easier standard and are designed as entry level tests.

② In most Grades, you would most likely offer 2 tests per grade and will usually only have a small number of competitors in any given class.

② It is entirely up to the Organising Committee which tests they choose to offer.

② To assist with the advertising of your event it is encouraged to inform EA of your schedule so EA Para equestrian riders can be notified directly of your event.
